WHEREAS, the City has previously twice adopted an ordinance to sell the described surplus real estate by bid under 65 ILCS 5/11-76-2 and received no bid on the parcel described on Exhibit A on either occasion; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the City Council hereby find that the requirements of 5/11-76-4.2 are met with respect to the parcel described on Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4.2 provides that the corporate authorities may by resolution authorize the sale of a parcel of the described parcel of surplus public real estate by the staff of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, this resolution is to be published once a week for three successive weeks in a daily or weekly newspaper; and

WHEREAS, no sale may be conducted until at least 30 days after first publication; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities are empowered by 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4.2 to accept any offer or bid determined by them to be in the best interests of the municipality by a vote of three-fourths of the corporate authorities then holding office.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Rock Falls, Whiteside County, Illinois as follows:

SECTION 3: The corporate authorities of the City hereby declare and find that sale of the property is in the best interests of the City.

SECTION 5: The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this resolution upon passage once a week for three successive weeks in a daily or weekly newspaper published in the county where the municipality is located.

SECTION 6: Offers or bids may be submitted to Mark Searing, City of Rock Falls Building Inspector, at 603 West 10th Street, Rock Falls, IL 61071, who is further authorized to solicit offers or bids on behalf of the City.

SECTION 7:	The corporate authorities are authorized to accept any offer or bid
determined by them to	be in the best interests of the municipality by a vote of three-fourths of the
corporate authorities t	hen holding office.

SECTION 8: The provisions and sections of this resolution shall be deemed to be separable, and the invalidity of any portion of this resolution shall not affect the validity of the remainder.

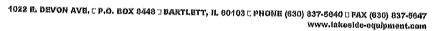
