WHEREAS, Section 11-20-7 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1-1-1 et. seq.) authorizes the corporate authorities of each municipality to provide for the removal of nuisance greenery such as weeds, grass, trees, and bushes, and to provide a penalty therefor; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to such authority, the City of Rock Falls (the "City") has incorporated the above provisions into the Rock Falls Municipal Code and has imposed a general penalty for the maintenance of such nuisance in the City; and

WHEREAS, Section 11-20-7 further authorizes a municipality to collect the reasonable removal cost incurred in removing and abating such nuisance; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City (the "Corporate Authorities") have considered including the costs to the City of removing such nuisance greenery with the general penalty currently provided in the Rock Falls Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City deem it in the best interests of the City and its residents to amend such provisions to include the costs to the City for removing such nuisance greenery, all as more specifically set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Rock Falls, Whiteside County, Illinois as follows:

SECTION 1: The recitals contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are true and correct and are hereby incorporated into this Section 1 as if more fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2: Chapter 20, Article II, Section 20-42(c) of the Rock Falls Municipal Code, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 20-42. Weeds, trees and bushes declared a nuisance.

(c) A violation of this section shall be punishable as a Class C violation as provided in section 1-41. In addition to such penalty, the city shall be entitled to collect the removal costs incurred by it pursuant to this section."

SECTION 3: In all other respects, Chapter 20, Article II, Section 20-42 of the Rock Falls Municipal Code shall remain in full force and effect as previously adopted and/or amended.

SECTION 4: The provisions and sections of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be separable and the invalidity of any portion of this ordinance shall not affect the validity of the remainder.

SECTION 5: The City Clerk is directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.

SECTION 6: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and publication as required by law.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Rock Falls that the Municipal Code of the City of Rock Falls be and the same is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1. Section 32-348 (a) of the Municipal Code of the City of Rock Falls is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 32-348 (a). Purchase power adjustment factor.

(a) The charges to all customers under all rates for all kilowatt hours in the billing period shall be increased or decreased by a purchase cost adjustment charge or credit (PPA factor) for each \$0.0001 or major fraction thereof by which the average cost of purchased power per kilowatt hour of input to the electrical system exceeds or is less than \$0.071 per kilowatt hour. The PPA factor shall be calculated by dividing the annual purchased power costs by the annual purchased and generated (hydroelectric plant) kilowatt hours, and by multiplying the quotient times a loss factor of 1.04 and by then subtracting from the product a base power cost of \$0.071 per kilowatt hour. The PPA to be applied to all customer charges shall be determined in March of each year based upon the prior 12 month period (March through February) and shall be effective as to all meter readings and billings rendered on and after the next succeeding May 1.

The PPA factor for the period May 1, 2021 through April 30, 2022 shall be \$0.00682.

- **Section 2.** In all other respects, Section 32-348 of the Municipal Code of the City of Rock Falls shall remain in full force and effect.
 - Section 3. All prior ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
- **Section 4.** If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or other portion of this ordinance is held or deemed to be unconstitutional or invalid, then such holding or finding of unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance.
- **Section 5.** This ordinance shall be effective upon its adoption, passage and publication in pamphlet form.

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 20, SECTION 20-48 RELATING TO PRAIRIE GRASS PLOTS WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS

WHEREAS, Section 11-20-7 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1-1-1 et. seq.) authorizes the corporate authorities of each municipality to provide for the regulation of greenery such as weeds, grass, trees, and bushes; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to such authority, the City of Rock Falls (the "City") has provided for the regulation of prairie grass plots within the City, including but not limited to the development, composition and management thereof; and

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois, by and through the Department of Natural Resources, has encouraged the preservation and management of native prairies, as well as the establishment of additional prairie grasses to their natural environment; and

WHEREAS, in response to the foregoing, the Mayor and City Council of the City (the "Corporate Authorities") desire to amend the provisions of the Rock Falls Municipal Code with respect to the establishment of prairie grasses within the City limits, all as more specifically set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Rock Falls, Whiteside County, Illinois as follows:

SECTION 1: The recitals contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are true and correct and are hereby incorporated into this Section 1 as if more fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2: Chapter 20, Article II, Section 20-48(b) of the Rock Falls Municipal Code, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"(b) *Definitions*. The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Burning means reduction by fire of prairie grass in a manner wholly consistent with IDNR rules and regulations.

IDNR means the Illinois Department of Natural Resources.

Noxious weeds means plants such as jimson, burdock, ragweed, thistle, cocklebur, milkweed or other similar plants involuntarily growing.

Prairie grass means any of four species of grasses identified as follows:

(1) Big bluestem (Andropogon gerardii);

- (2) Little bluestem (Schizachyrium scoparius);
- (3) Sideoats grama (Bouteloua curtipendula);
- (4) Indiangrass (Sorghastrum nutans).

Setback means a space between prairie grass plots and adjoining land or properties intended to reduce the impact of a prairie grass plot on the adjacent properties."

SECTION 3: Chapter 20, Article II, Section 20-48(c)(2) of the Rock Falls Municipal Code, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

- "(c) Development permits.
 - (2) upon approval of a submitted plan, the city will issue conditional permission to proceed with planning to the proposing property owner. The proposing property owner shall then be required to seek and gain acceptance into the IDNR's Acres for Wildlife program or any successor or replacement program thereof. Upon submission to the city of a copy of the letter of acceptance into that program, as applicable, final permission will be granted by issuance of a permit by the building official. Neither construction, tillage, nor any other physical amendment to the property proposed for development of the prairie grass plot shall occur before issuance of a permit by the city."

SECTION 4: Chapter 20, Article II, Section 20-48(f) of the Rock Falls Municipal Code, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"(f) *Minimum plot size*. Prairie grass plots within the corporate limits of the city shall be no less than one acre in size in M-1 and M-2 zoning districts, and three acres in R-2, R-3, R-4 districts. Those areas of a property included in setbacks shall not be included in the calculation of the minimum plot size. Prairie grass plots shall not be permitted in any R-1, B-1 or B-2 district. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a prairie grass plot of less than three acres may be established on property located in R-2, R-3 and R-4 districts if such property is owned by, and established for purposes consistent with the operation of, a park district. In such instances, prior to the issuance of a permit for the development of such prairie grass plot, the owner shall demonstrate to the city building department that the maintenance of such plot will not cause an unreasonable risk of fire or other hazard to adjoining properties and structures."

SECTION 5: Chapter 20, Article II, Section 20-48(i) of the Rock Falls Municipal Code, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"(i) *Maintenance*. All plots of prairie grass permitted pursuant to this section shall remain enrolled in and in good standing with the IDNR's Acres for Wildlife program, or any successor or replacement program, and must comply with all guidelines established by that program, all of which guidelines are hereby adopted by reference into this section. All plots of prairie grass shall be kept free of involuntary or voluntary trees and shrubs, and of all weeds, including noxious weeds. Notwithstanding other provisions hereof, ornamental grasses shall be permitted to be grown within 20 feet of the perimeter of any water retention or detention facility in any zoning classification."

SECTION 6: In all other respects, Chapter 20, Article II, Section 20-48 of the Rock Falls Municipal Code shall remain in full force and effect as previously adopted and/or amended.

SECTION 7: The City Council finds that the customary practice of requiring a first and second reading of ordinances is not applicable or necessary in the case of this ordinance, and a first reading preliminary to adoption hereof is hereby waived, and this ordinance shall become effective upon its passage.

SECTION 8: The provisions and sections of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be separable and the invalidity of any portion of this ordinance shall not affect the validity of the remainder.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the foregoing, the City of Rock Falls (the "City") owns and operates its own electrical distribution system for the purpose of providing electrical power to the residents and businesses of the City; and

WHEREAS, following a review of the monthly rates charged to customers of the City's electrical utility, and in response to the economic hardship experienced by the residents and businesses of the City due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Mayor and City Council (collectively, the "Corporate Authorities") of the City have considered foregoing the annual increase to monthly electrical charges for the 2022 fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, after careful consideration, the Corporate Authorities have determined it in the best interests of the City and its residents to amend the provisions of the City Code as it relates to monthly electrical charges to forego the annual increase for the 2022 fiscal year, all as more specifically set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Rock Falls, Whiteside County, Illinois as follows:

SECTION 1: The City hereby finds that all of the recitals contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are true and correct and does incorporate them into this Ordinance by this reference.

SECTION 2: Chapter 32, Article V, Section 32-376(b) of the Rock Falls Municipal Code, as amended, shall be further amended to read as follows:

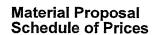
