

ANNUAL REPORT 2011

STATE OF POLICE SERVICE

In 2011 the Rock Falls Police Department responded to 16,573 "calls for service", of those, 299 were motor vehicle accidents. The department received a total of 3,763 "E911" calls.

In comparison in 2010 the "calls for service" totaled 16,850; of those, 329 were motor vehicles accidents. The department received a total of 3,471 "E911" calls.

Overtime was down some in patrol but up in telecommunications. In telecommunications this was due to the department being short one Telecommunicator who was out on family medical leave after an in depth surgery from late 2010 to mid 2011. No replacement Telecommunicator was hired and trained until March 2011. In October of 2011 that newly trained Telecommunicator was hired to replace an officer that unexpectedly left the department.

In Patrol one officer who was injured in a fight in 2010 was still out on disability. In January of 2011 another officer was placed on military deployment until December of 2011. With both Officers out of service the overtime increased to cover the busy weekend calls and vacation coverage.

The citizens and businesses of Rock Falls and surrounding communities donated over \$12,000.00 for the purchase and training of a new K-9 to replace Axle. In June of 2011 with the donated money a K-9 (named NERO) was purchased. Sr. Patrolman Jeremy Vondra was selected as the new K-9 handler. Both Jeremy and K-9 Nero left for training in August of 2011 at the Illinois State Police Academy. K-9 handler and NERO graduated in November of 2011 and have been patrolling the streets since.

We continue to stress the need for continuous training. The year 2011 was almost 1000hrs short compared to 2010 in training hours. This is a major concern within the department. I believe we can continue to provide the services the citizens of Rock Falls expect and deserve.







TRAFFIC ARRESTS since 2006




TOTAL ARRESTS FOR 2011

City Ordinance Violations




The year 2011 was the first full year of the Municipal Court System


