# REGULAR MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND ALDERMAN OF THE CITY OF ROCK FALLS May 18, 2010

The regular meeting of the Mayor and Alderman of the City of Rock Falls was called to order at the hour of 6:30 p.m., May 18, 2010 in Rock Falls, Illinois by Mayor David Blanton.

City Clerk, William B. Wescott, called the roll, present were Mayor Blanton, Alderman Vandersnick, Reitzel, Kuhlemier, Schuneman, Hand, Folsom and Thurm. Alderman Snow was absent.

### Audience Request:

Mr. Todd Jones, 610 Avenue A, Rock Falls, Illinois addressed the Council in regards to the recent heavy rains and flooding in several basements located in the 500-600 block of Avenue A. He realized that the rains recently in the area were more excessive that normal, however, he points out a problem even in matters of less rain and drainage near E. 6<sup>th</sup> St. & Ave. A. He has lived in his home for 14 years, and this has remained a constant problem. The Council acknowledges a problem with the Stormwater drainage in the area related to First Avenue. Mr. Cox, Sewer Supt. will have his crews in the area tomorrow morning to clean out the catch basins and look into the problem. Mr. Jones thanked the Council for there time.

City Clerk Wescott read a Proclamation which recognizes the value and accomplishments of members of the EMS Team within the Community, designating May 16-22, 2010 as Emergency Medical Services Week in the Community. **Motion: Hand; Second: Folsom; Vote: (7) ayes, motion carried**.

Ms. Butcher was the recent recipient of the Ronald Regan Award for the Best Regional Scene for "Pelican on the Rock River," at the 63<sup>rd</sup> Annual Phidian Art Show. Kaleen Church, 2010 Rock Falls American Legion Auxiliary Poppy Queen was present and addressed the Council and asked there support in getting out the word about the upcoming Poppy Day. Kaleen sold the first Poppy to Mayor Blanton and members of the Council.

Department Heads:

Wastewater- Mr. Cox presented an update on the progress being made on the new Waste Water Treatment Plant. All aspects of the project are back on schedule as of this presentation.

Police- Chief Kuelper:

- 1. His Department received a Tobacco Grant in the amount of \$1500.00 for the 8<sup>th</sup> consecutive year. This will be utilized for the enforcement of Tobacco related issues.
- 2. The Chief publicly thanked the citizens and business of the City for there generosity in making contributions towards the purchase of a new K-9 Officer. The \$10,000 goal necessary is about to be achieved.

Water/Street- Mr. Padilla

- The installation of the new 6" water main to replace the old 2" is complete on Ave B from E. 2<sup>nd</sup> St. to E. 3<sup>rd</sup> St. Water flow and sampling will be finished this week and all is expected to go well.
- 2. Remind the Public that starting during the month of June, the Fire Department will be doing hydrant flushing in combination with the annual flow testing for the hydrant ratings. Citizens need to be aware that they may experience some discoloration in the water system during these periods, however, it will be short lived.

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### Ward Reports:

Ward 2 – Mr. Kuhlemier will be attending the Louie Bellson Headstone Dedication Program to on May 20<sup>th</sup> at the Riverside Cemetery in Moline, Illinois. Louie was a true son of Rock Falls, authoring and arranging over 1,000 musical pieces, while performing with every Big Band throughout the world. The Bellson's were truly a musical family. We were very fortunate to have such a person who called Rock Falls his hometown.

### Mayor's Report:

Mayor Blanton reported to the Council on the recent Northern Illinois Mayor's Meeting. Several representatives from the State Senate were present and could shed no light on what is happening in Springfield with the budget. In essence, the statements made were that the bills were left on the desk of the Governor and when he decides what to do; he can call the house and senate back into session.
