8. Committee Member Items.	 Discussed Phase I & Phase II of the parking lot upgrades at the Electric Department. Approved a Phase I change order for \$12,772.00 to Murray Excavating for additional work along the south side of the building. Discussed Phase II which would handle from mid-point on the south side of the building to all the way out to Industrial Park Road. This price is estimated to be \$67,758.60. The Committee does not see a problem with this change order, although Mr. Jakubczak will need to check with the City Attorney to make sure that this is legal and we can issue a change order as this money has been budgeted for this. The Electric Department has been contacted by a local resident due to the Make-A-Wish Foundation regarding the installation of a swimming pool. I informed resident the City would be donating the underground trenching and cable for their service if they would be willing to pick up the cost for a local electrician to move their meter base from the backyard to the side yard.
