# REGULAR MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND ALDERMAN OF THE CITY OF ROCK FALLS May 15, 2012

The regular meeting of the Mayor and Alderman of the City of Rock Falls was called to order at 6:30 p.m. on May 15, 2012 in Rock Falls, Illinois by Mayor David H. Blanton, City Clerk, William Wescott, called the roll following the pledge of allegiance, present was Mayor Blanton, Ald. Vandersnick, Reitzel, Kuhlemier, Hand, Schuneman, and Folsom. (Ald. Snow and Thurm were absent) In addition, Attorney Jim Reese and City Administrator Robbin Blackert were present.

## **Special Scholarship Presentation:**

Mr. Ed Cobau, Director of State Association of Services and Communication for the Illinois Municipal Utilities Association was present to award to Ms. Kayla Jakubczak the 2012 Scholarship Award for her essay submission. Mr. Cobau told the council that this is the thirteenth (13<sup>th</sup>) year for the program and to date 27 students have been awarded a total of \$57,000 through this program. Applicants are given the opportunity to submit an essay in response to a question concerning Electrical, Water or Gas Utilities. Ms. Jakubczak was one of 37 submittals under the Electric Category and was named a winner of a \$500.00 scholarship. The local agency traditionally matches the scholarship award and the Rock Falls Electrical Utilities wanted to keep this tradition in place and awarded an additional \$500, bringing the total scholarship award to \$1,000.00. Ms. Jakubczak thanked all present and will be utilizing the scholarship funds to attend the University of North Carolina next year.

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#### Information/Correspondence:

City Clerk Wescott brought forth two (2) items of information for the Council:

- Presented a brief report on the status of HB 3637 and the three (3) attached amendments being presented by
  Speaker Madigan. If the bill and its amendments are successfully passed, Municipalities, School Districts and other
  divisions of local government that would normally receive CCPRT funds would lose the funding, totaling \$1-1.5 billion
  dollars per year. The monies would be utilized by the State of Illinois to fund the States responsibilities under the TRS
  Pension. Our local municipality would stand t loose \$49,932.00 and the Fire District, \$9,555.
- 2. Read into the record a thank you from the Family of Robert "Bob" Machnicki, for the flowers, phone calls and condolences expressed at the time of Bob's passing. Bob had served the City of Rock Falls as Alderman, Treasurer and on other civic committees. He truly enjoyed working with his constituents, and had a tremendous pride in his City, he shall be missed.

#### **Mayors Request:**

Mayor Blanton presented a brief overview on the following items:

- 1. Working with IDOT and Civil Construction in regards to a staging area for the construction of the First Avenue Bridge with the start of phase 2 in June.
- Attended the Northern Illinois Mayor's Meeting which had as a speaker a representative from the Attorney General's Office.
- 3. Brief the Council on the States suggestion to start charging for admission to State Parks with the implementation of day passes.
- 4. Informed the Council that he and Alderman Kuhlemier had been to Morrison to attend the Route 30 Project Meeting. Basically, after 5 years of discussion, no plan is in place, and in fact, the road placement is still in the air due to 2011 Flood Plane Act.
- 5. Mayor will be attending the upcoming Mayor's Prayer Breakfast, this year's theme, "Under One God, One Nation".
- Rock River Trail Initiative has met and is in discussion concerning a placement of a portage are for Kayaks and canoe traffic.
- Announced that there would be an Armed Forces Day celebrated in Veteran's Memorial Park on May 19, 2012 beginning at 1:00 p.m.
