	month.	
	Mayor Wescott stated that the City's part of the tax bill is 10% and that is all we can control.	
	The funding percentages of these pensions are not as they used to be, but the City is doing	
	better than many others. Adm. Blackert suggested that the city work with the schools to get	
	the crossing guards back on the school's payroll.	
	Alderman Reitzel, and Schuneman agree that the truth in taxation hearing should be done	
	next year.	
	Alderman Watts is concerned that having 8 years of being just under the 5% mark could	
	appear that the City is trying to avoid a hearing.
