

# REGULAR MEETING MINUTES OF THE MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF ROCK FALLS

#### October 3rd, 2017

The regular meeting of the Mayor and City Council of Rock Falls, Illinois was called to order by Mayor William B. Wescott at 6:30 p.m. on October 3rd, 2017 in the Council Chambers of Rock Falls.

City Clerk Eric Arduini called the roll following the pledge of allegiance. A quorum was present including Aldermen Reitzel, Snow, Kuhlemier, Schuneman, Kleckler, and Sobottka. Alderman Logan, and Folsom were absent. In addition City Attorney Jim Reese and City Administrator Robbin Blackert were present.

#### **Audience Requests:**

Terry Papoccia owner of Docks on the Rock Marina addressed the Council. Mr. Papoccia informed the Council that he currently has 17 docks on the water, and has 25 people requesting additional space. Mr. Papoccia spoke about the proposed restaurant at his property. He stated that it was his intention to close it at 9:00pm, and he has spoken with many neighbors who were fine with it. Mr. Papoccia spoke briefly about the Rock Falls website, and the asset of the Rock River to the City.

Mayor Wescott stated that the City may support the ideas, but the location is outside of City limits, and all requests will need to go through the county. It was explained that the zoning request would need to be approved by ¾ of the County Board.

#### **Proclamation:**

YWCA Executive Director Rebecca Munoz-Ripley informed the Council that October is observed across the nation as Domestic Violence Awareness Month. Domestic violence happens in all sizes of cities. The YWCA helped 765 victims last year, and abuse happens to all types of people. One in four women are victims of domestic violence. Purple ribbons were offered to the City Council.

City Clerk Eric Arduini read aloud the Domestic Violence Awareness Month Proclamation. A motion to approve the proclamation was made by Alderman Snow, and second by Alderman Reitzel.

#### Vote 6 aye, motion carried

Twin Cities Joint Fire Command Chief Gary Cook informed the Council that Fire Prevention Week is an annual event. The Fire department visits the grade schools and teaches the children about fire prevention. This year's emphasis is to teach families about having escape meeting places. Survival is not good if a child were to re-enter a burning house looking for someone. It is simple thing, but it needs to be practiced. Clerk Arduini read the proclamation aloud. A motion to approve the proclamation of Fire Prevention Week October 8-14 was made by Alderman Schuneman, and second by Alderman Snow. Alderman Snow mentioned that it is also a good idea to change the batteries in your smoke detector with the upcoming time change.

#### Vote 6 aye, motion carried

#### Consent Agenda:

The consent agenda was read aloud by Mayor Wescott. A motion to approve the consent agenda as presented by omnibus designation was made by Alderman Schuneman and second by Alderman Sobottka.

A motion was made by Alderman Kuhlemier, and second by Alderman Snow for the approval of **Ordinance 2017-2344** authorizing the Mayor to execute an amended agreement with the Rock Falls Rural Fire Protection District. Alderman Kleckler inquired if there were two agreements to be approved.

#### Ordinance Second Reading / Adoption:

A motion was made by Alderman Snow, and second by Alderman Reitzel for the adoption of **Ordinance 2017-2340** for the sale or transfer of 2001 Dodge 1500 truck to Firehouse Ministries.

### Vote 6 aye, motion carried

A motion was made by Alderman Schuneman and second by Alderman Sobottka for the adoption of **Ordinance 2017-2341** authorizing a lease agreement with Firehouse of God Ministries for property to be used as a recycling center at 2400 1st Avenue.

#### Vote 6 aye, motion carried

A motion was made by Alderman Snow and second by Alderman Kuhlemier for the adoption of **Ordinance 2017-2342** authorizing a lease agreement with Firehouse of God Ministries for property to be used as the Fire Museum at 403 West 2nd Street.

### Vote 6 aye, motion carried

#### City Administrator Robbin Blackert:

A motion was made by Alderman Kuhlemier, and second by Alderman Schuneman to approve the letter of engagement with MWM Consulting Group, 55 E Jackson Blvd # 1000, Chicago, IL for actuarial services for the City's other postemployment benefit (OPEB) programs other than pensions covered under GASB 67/68 GASB 45, 73, 74 & 75 in the amount of \$8500.00. Alderman Kuhlemier stated that it is clear proof that GASB is becoming a bigger influence on municipal finances.

#### Vote 6 aye, motion carried

Administrator Blackert reminded the Council that there will be a special Finance Committee meeting at 5:00pm on October 10<sup>th</sup>, 2017 to review the audit with Sikich.

#### **Department Heads:**

#### Dick Simon - Electric Department

A motion was made by Alderman Schuneman, and second by Alderman Kuhlemier to approve the maintenance agreement with Altorfer - 101 Pinecrest Drive, Peoria, IL. for the years of 2018 through 2023 in the amount of \$52,128.00 per year. Mr. Simon explained that this agreement is for all nine of our units. Mayor Wescott added that this is an 11.1% decrease in costs from our last agreement.

Mr. Simon informed the Council that it is Public Power week, and asked them to thank a lineman when they see them.

#### Tourism - Janell Loos

Tourism Director Janell Loos informed the Council that the 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Sauk Valley area Pink Heals tour was held recently. They were able to make 25 visits in two days. Partnerships with the sponsors, and supporters are vital for the success of the event, and appreciated.

Mayor Wescott added that the overall director for the United States was in Rock Falls for the event. Director Loos stated that this was the first time that he had seen pink fireworks, and the first time that they had made a stop at a church.

Alderman Kuhlemier added that the Pink Fireworks were a special treat.

#### Ward Reports:

#### Ward 1:

Alderman Daehle Reitzel informed the council that the Public Works Committee will be updating their plans for street and sidewalk repairs. He asks that the Aldermen give him lists of areas that need work in their wards. He also congratulated Mayor Wescott in becoming the president of the Illinois Mayors Association. Mayor Wescott mentioned the bid opening for a storm water project on October 12<sup>th</sup>, 2017.

#### Ward 2:

Alderman Glen Kuhlemier gave his thoughts and prayers to the survivors of Las Vegas shooting. He also informed the Council that there will be a Blackhawk Area Economic Development Conference held from 8:30am-1:30pm on October 28<sup>th</sup> at Timberlake Playhouse. He is also happy to see development at the former Stanley property.

Alderman Brian Snow asked for a moment of silence for the Las Vegas victims, first responders, and EMS.

#### Ward 3:

Alderman Jim Schuneman echoed the thoughts and prayers for the people of Las Vegas.

Alderman Kleckler voiced his opposition to two public works projects. Curb, gutter, and sidewalk replacement along west 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, and the Gazebo being built on East 2<sup>nd</sup> Street. He believes that neither of the projects were approved by Public Works, and the payments should not be made out of the general fund.

#### Ward 4:

Alderman Violet Sobottka gave her thoughts and prayers to the people of Las Vegas.

#### Mayor's Report:

Mayor Wescott presented an outline of the TIF conference, and IML conference that he had attended. He informed the Council about Illinois pension remedies that have been developed by the IML. They are in bill format, and can be sent to the legislature for discussion.

With nothing else for the good of the Council a motion was made by Alderman Snow and second by Alderman Sobottka to adjourn the meeting at 7:15pm.



#### **SECTION 1: RECITALS**

- A. The City and District previously entered into an Agreement, beginning in 2004, providing for the provision of fire protection by the City within the District, in exchange for, a set forth and agreed reimbursement of costs, as outlined within that prior Agreement.
- B. The parties have not updated the prior Agreement for a period of 13 years, but in an effort to address issues the parties engaged in conversation in the fall of 2016 regarding the need for the District to increase and maximize its existing levy, to increase the amount of reimbursement of cost to the City.
- C. Based on the conversation and agreements reached to update the terms of the Parties relationship the Parties herein update the terms of the Agreement by entry into this First Amended Agreement..
- 1. Service. The City agrees to furnish fire protection to all the territory now or hereafter included in the District for the period from date of execution of this Agreement through April 30, 2018 and annually each year thereafter until the terms of this Agreement are terminated, in a similar manner and to a similar extent as such fire protection is furnished within the limits of the City, albeit consistent with established standards. All service and equipment shall meet the rural fire department standards of the Illinois Inspection Bureau. It is specifically understood and agreed that fire hydrants and City water may and shall be used in fighting fires in the District when necessary or convenient and that no additional charges shall be made for such water or fire hydrant services or use.

- 2. <u>Payment</u>. The District shall pay the following amounts to the City for fire protection services to be provided:
  - (a) for the period from date of the Section of Agreement through April 30, 2018, a sum equal to ninety (90) percent of revenues received and earned by the District during the period from May 1, 2016 through November 30, 2017, from tax levies, personal property replacement tax, service fees from out-of-district residents and investment income on invested funds of the District;
  - (b) for the period from May 1, 2018 through April 30, 2019, and each and every year thereafter (if this Agreement is not terminated pursuant to paragraph 8), a sum equal to ninety (90) percent of revenues received and earned during the period from December 1, 2017 through November 30, 2018, received by the District from tax levies, personal property replacement tax, service fees from out-of-district residents and investment income on invested funds of the District.
  - (c) for the period from May 1, 2019 through April 30, 2020, and each and every year thereafter (if this Agreement is not terminated pursuant to paragraph 8), a sum equal to ninety (90) percent of revenues received and earned during the period from December 1<sup>st</sup> of each prior calendar year through November 30<sup>th</sup> of the subsequent year by the District from tax levies, personal property replacement tax, service fees from out-of-district residents and investment income on invested funds of the District.
- 3. <u>Payment</u>. Payment of the amounts due pursuant to paragraph 2 hereof shall be made by the District to the City within 21 days of December 1<sup>st</sup>, upon invoice and request received by the City.

- 4. <u>Levy</u>. For purposes of this Agreement, the District agrees that it shall annually levy an amount determined by multiplying the rate levied by the City for fire protection services for the most recent ascertainable year times all assessable property within the District. City agrees to furnish to the District by October 1 of each year the rate levied by the City for the most recent year for fire protection services. For purposes of this Agreement, "rate levied by the City for fire protection services" shall mean the percent rate levied by the City for fire protection tax and for firefighter's pension combined. If the rate formula in this paragraph, however, exceeds the maximum permitted by law to be levied by District, then District shall levy an amount not less than 30 cents per \$100 valuation based on the previous years equalized assessed value for property within the District or such greater amount as may be permitted by law.
- 5. <u>District Charges</u>. District agrees that it shall establish a schedule of service fees and charges to be made and assessed against out of district residents and that said schedule shall be revised from time to time to permit the charging of the maximum amounts by applicable law for service to such out of district residents.
- 6. <u>City</u>. The City agrees to meet such State standards for fire protection as is possible with the revenue available for such purposes, including the monies paid under this Contract. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the City makes no guarantee of response times, the District recognizing that many of the properties and residents to be served under this Agreement lie at a greater distance from the station house maintained by the City than all of the area in the City.
- 7. Records. The City shall maintain adequate records of the expenses of the fire department and the services rendered within the City and in the District, and shall compile all reports required by the State either within the City or in the District. The City shall annually furnish the District with a report of all fires in the District, including the date, nature and location thereof and the extent of loss and such other information as may be reasonably required by the District. The District shall provide to the City a copy of its annual audit upon receipt, and copies of all reports filed by the District with the State of Illinois, simultaneously with the filing thereof.

- 8. <u>Cooperation</u>. It is understood and agreed that the District and the City and the officials of each shall cooperate to secure for the District such reclassification as may be possible or appropriate for the reduction of fire insurance premiums on the property in the District.
- 9. Renewal/Termination. Unless terminated in accordance with this paragraph, this Agreement shall continue beyond April 30, 2018 from year to year, and shall be a year to year agreement thereafter, and all of the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall continue to apply. Either party may terminate this Agreement by giving notice, in writing, of intention to terminate to the other party at least sixty (60) days in advance of the end of any term. Upon termination of this Agreement, neither party shall be obligated under the terms and provisions hereof other than to the extent of monies due and owing for periods of service by the City.
- 10. Replacement of Prior Agreement. By execution and entrance into this Amended Agreement, it is the parties intent to replace and supersede the prior Agreement, originally effective in 2004.
- 11. <u>Maps</u>. The City agrees to reasonably maintain maps and other records as may be required by the ISO Class 9 standards and make periodic inspections to determine if signs and numbering within the District's boundaries are being properly maintained.
- 12. <u>Foreign Fire Insurance Proceeds</u>. To the extent permitted by law, the District shall remit to the City, in addition to those funds set forth in paragraph 2, any Foreign Fire Insurance Funds received by the District. All such funds shall be expended in accordance with all relevant provisions of Illinois law.

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## ROCK FALLS TOURISM FAÇADE IMPROVEMENT GRANT COMMITTEE

### Summary

The Façade Improvement Grant Committee (FIC) met on Friday September 29th to discuss two new grant applications. They were both approved. Changes and/or additions were also discussed. The recommendations by the FIC to be approved by the Tourism Committee are as follows: Façade Grant Qualifications, Approvals of Facade Grant Applications and the remaining Façade Grant Funds that are unused.

## Façade Grant Qualifications

It has come to our attention that businesses want to utilize the façade grant but in most cases are only able to do improvements in small increments. Paying up to or over \$10,000.00 for improvements by the business owner, then submitting for reimbursement (50% reimbursement up to \$5000.00) by the Tourism Committee has proven out of reach for many interested businesses.

#### OUR RECOMMENDATIONS:

One business and/or owner can apply for multiple grants per year for a maximum amount of \$5000.00 reimbursement per fiscal year. Each application will be evaluated by the FIC on its own merits. The approval of one grant application does not guarantee approval of future applications within the fiscal year.

Currently, there is nothing in the language of the grant application stating that a business and/or owner can or cannot apply for a Façade Grant Application every fiscal year. It is the request of the FIC that businesses that qualify and are in good standing with the City of Rock Falls be allowed to apply for grants every fiscal year.

## Approvals of Façade Grant Applications

The Façade grant committee can evaluate and approve applications. The Rock Falls Tourism Committee has final approval for reimbursement. Therefore, applicants are not waiting possibly up to 2 months for approval to begin work.

## Remaining Façade Grant Funds

The Façade Grant Committee would like to move forward in utilizing the remaining unused funds from the Façade Grant starting with FY 18 and continue to use unused funds each fiscal year. January 1st will be the cutoff date for all Façade Improvement Applications to be received for each fiscal year.

The remaining funds would be used to finance beautification projects within the target area of the Façade Improvement Program. Much of the older street furniture (benches, planters, trash cans, etc.) is reaching the end of usefulness, is non-existent, or lacks a coherent aesthetic look. Even though some of these items are functional, they add little appeal to the downtown streetscape. Some locations in the designated target area lack the aesthetic elements which encourage foot traffic. Signs directing to local attractions and parking are limited or non-existent, and the current signs often seem cluttered and lack cohesion.

All of these elements are key to maintaining vitality in Rock Falls. Improving and updating the downtown streetscape will not only increase the beauty of the town, it will enhance the perception of our town as welcoming, safe and pedestrian-friendly. Improving the Rock Falls Downtown within the Façade Improvement Grant designated target area will help increase pedestrian traffic from the hotel and local residents. It will become a place where people want to shop, dine, work and live.

The proposed utilization of the remaining unused funds from the Façade Improvement Grant includes, new street furniture such as benches, trash cans, bike racks and planters, and an audio sound system to bring music to the downtown area. Also planned is a downtown signage system including wayfaring.
