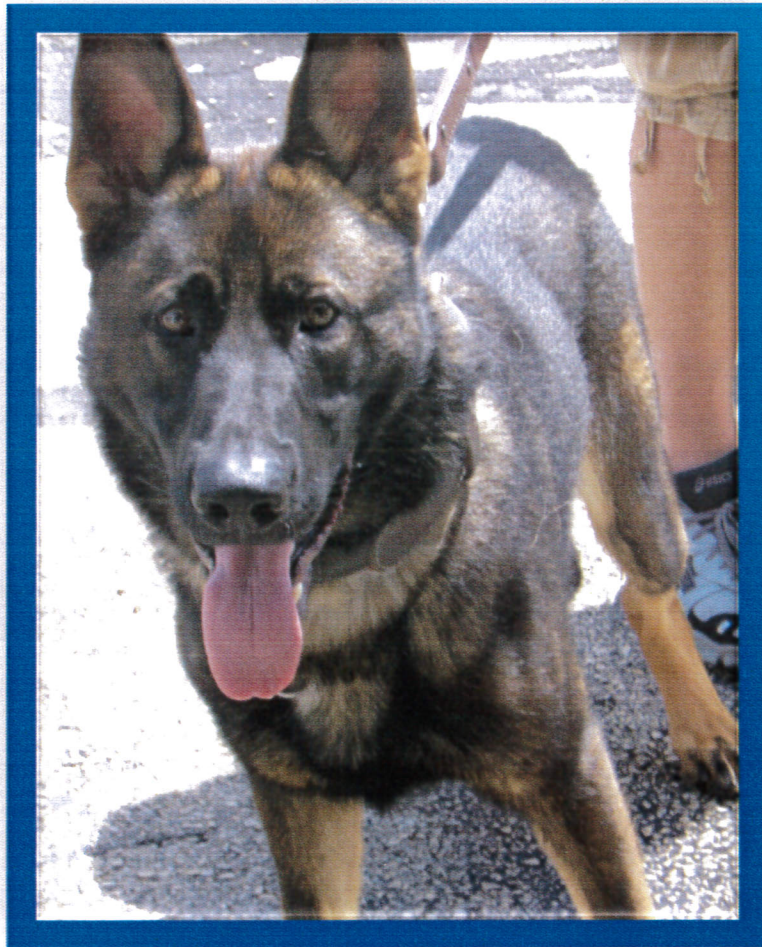

K-9 YEAR END REPORT

2016

Through the year 2016, K-9 Nero and I were called upon a total of 150 times by the Rock Falls Police Department and surrounding law enforcement agencies. In total we performed 114 free-air sniffs, 17 tracks, 7 article searches, 6 school searches, 4 demonstrations, 1 apprehension of a wanted subject, and 1 building search for narcotics for the Blackhawk Area Task Force.

The items seized during our deployments consisted of 167.2g of cannabis, 36 items of drug paraphernalia, 21 pills of controlled substances, 4g of synthetic cannabis, or "K2", and 1g of crack cocaine. These incidents resulted in 28 arrests.

We also completed 180 hours of training to refine our skillset throughout the year.

This year was my first full year of working alongside Nero, and I am very pleased with what we were able to accomplish. Together, I believe we were able to further establish ourselves as a reliable and reputable K-9 team. I am looking forward to another year of working with K-9 Nero and using our experiences from 2016 to make 2017 an even more successful year.

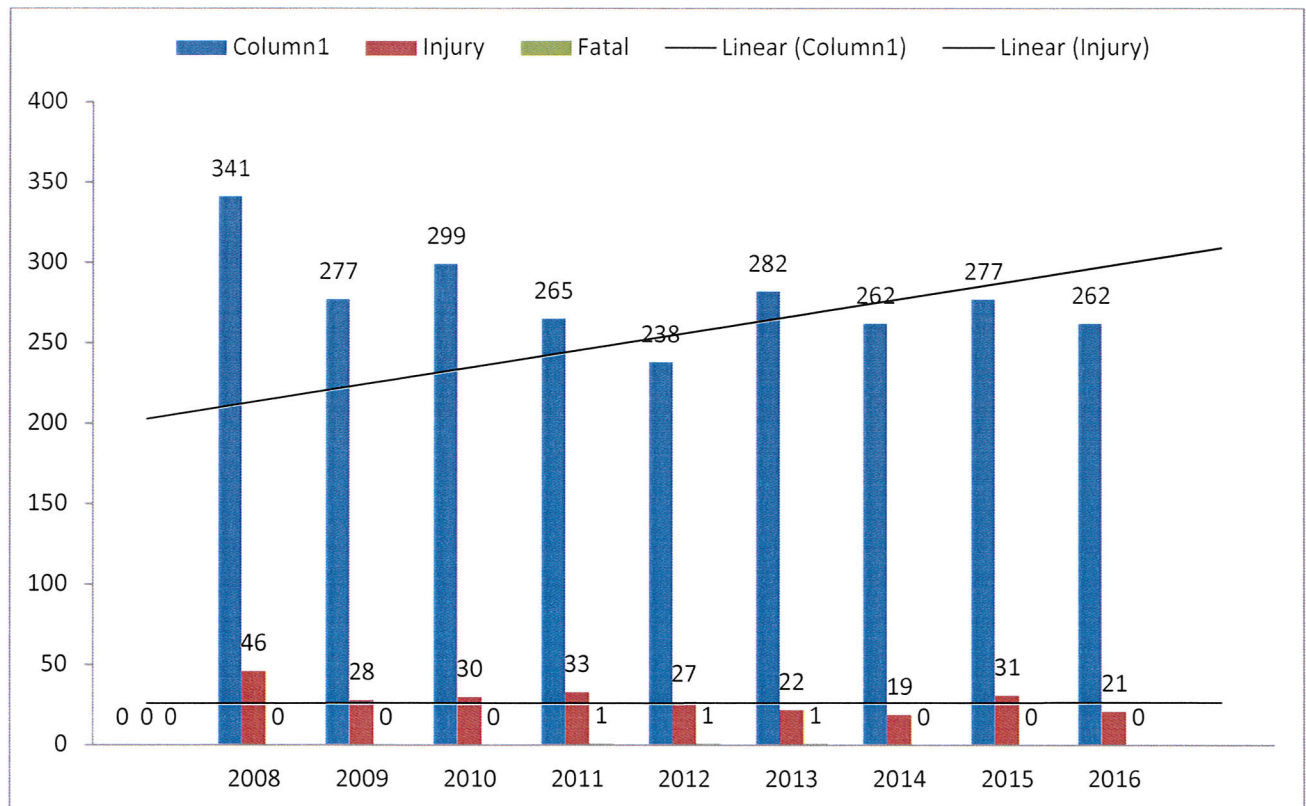

YEAR END REPORT

In 2016 the Rock Falls Police Department responded to 18, 526 "calls for service", of those, 283 were motor vehicle accidents. The Department also received 3,713 Emergency 911 calls.

In comparison in 2015 the "calls for service" totaled 21,019, of those, 308 were motor vehicle accidents. In 2015 the department received a total of 4,082 emergency 911 calls.

We are currently down two patrol officers . Both new recruits will be going to the Police Academy in January and will return on March 30th, 2017.

At the beginning of 2016 we implemented the Safe Passage Initiative for opiate addiction. This program allows Law Enforcement agencies to place people directly into treatment for their addiction. We have partnerships with twelve different treatment Centers in Illinois. Since the start of the year we have placed 15 people into treatment in Rock Falls. This program has been very successful, and we are making efforts to expand the program in Whiteside County. We have formed a coalition of Community leaders to talk about ways to expand this program.

We started up "Coffee with a Cop", and hope to see this effort expand and help build a stronger bond with our community.

In September 2016, we adopted a "comfort dog" for our Police Department. Lacey is a female Lab/border collie mix adopted from our local Happy Tails Organization. Happy Tails has agreed to sponsor Lacey for life and she has been a comforting presence in our Department.
