Overview:

Throughout 2018, 101 cases were referred to the Investigations Division. Investigation of these cases resulted in 16 felony arrests/arrest warrants. Sex offenses and financial crimes were the most common types of cases referred to Detectives in 2018. There was a substantial increase in theft and fraud related cases referred to the Investigations Division which could be directly attributed to the increase in methamphetamine use in the area. More than 20 interviews were conducted at April House Child Advocacy Center in reference to child abuse and sexual abuse.

Detectives assisted Patrol Division on more than **40** occasions and assisted other agencies 23 times throughout the year. A detective was called out after regular hours **24** times in 2018.

The Investigations Division took in just over 300 individual exhibits of evidence in 2018.

Background investigations were conducted on 12 police officer applicants, with only 1 passing all phases of the hiring process. The recruitment of qualified applicants for police officer openings is proving difficult and is part of a nationwide trend and the background investigation process is quite time-consuming.

In early 2018, Patrol Officer Elise Dusek was assigned to investigations. Dusek resigned her position at RFPD in April to take a position with DeKalb Police. Patrol Officer Betony Kilberg was assigned to investigations in August.

Detective Kilberg attended a 40-hour New Investigator training and the 40-hour Lead Homicide Investigator certification course in 2018. Detective Sergeant Pilgrim and Detective Kilberg obtained their certification for Trauma Informed Sexual Assault Investigations as mandated by law. Detective Sergeant Pilgrim received 24 hours of training on non-confrontational interview and interrogation techniques and 16-hours of legal updates and best practices for law enforcement.





YEAR END REPORT

In 2018, the Rock Falls Police Department responded to 12,372"calls for service", of those, 247 were motor vehicle accidents. The Department also received 3,388 Emergency 911 calls.

We had three Officers resign and one Commander retire which put us down four Officers. In addition to that we promoted Officer Ludwig as the School Resource Officer, which left another vacancy in Patrol when school started. This placed a great burden on our shifts, however we did hire one Officer and are looking to hire three additional Officers to regain full Patrol shifts.

The Rock Falls Police Department was able to outfit all of the Patrol Officers with Axon body cameras in 2018. This positive measure ensures the public more transparency and builds a greater trust between Law Enforcement and the citizens.

With an ever growing substance abuse issue in our communities, the word has quickly spread that Rock Falls Police Department will go the extra mile to help the drug addicted get into treatment.

In 2018, we started up our Bike Patrol again, however with our being short shifted, officers were not able to utilized the Police bikes as much as we hoped, however we are hoping to rectify that issue in 2019.
